CAPACITY LIMITS UPDATE

Please note the latest update to Reopening Ontario:

Ontario: A Plan to Safely Reopen

As of Monday, the Ontario government lifted capacity limits for many locations including:

Locations where a wedding, funeral or religious service, rite or ceremony takes place may also implement proof of vaccination requirements for services, rites, or ceremonies at the location.

Please ensure you check with your local health unit as to what this means for worship practices, such as singing. Lifting capacity limits for a space may impact what can happen in that space. Advice varies from health unit to health unit based on area transmission rates.

If instituting proof of vaccination requirements for worship, please also consider how you will reach those who are not present in person. Many congregations have developed hybrid models to be able to connect the in-person congregation with the virtual one. Many thanks to congregational leaders who serve on reopening committees and are working hard to protect the safety of their community and to abide by the evolving changes.
